


Context Building: Finding Our Audience











Results: Student Grade Levels




Results: Preferred Floor Level

FLOOR POPULARITY




1st and 2nd level are the most socially thriving

Results: Individual vs. Group Study




Students are doing individual work in a group setting



Context Building: Key Takeaways from Finding Our Audience

• This activity was designed for us to understand our audience by asking students to co-design the learning commons with existing resources and new resources











Mid-Point Check in


- The learning commons has underutilized space that we are able to optimize.

 - oPC's can be displaced around the library.









Design & Prototyping: Original Layout Design & Prototyping: Plan of Action
















Rubric for Observation


- 1. What is the overall noise level?

- 5. Describe the buzz you see happening.




























Results: Student Feedback & Observations

Results: Student Feedback & Observations


On a scale of 1-10, how much do you like the new layout of the Learning Commons? 33 responses

Results Summary

- We were able to reproduce the "buzz" from the Starbucks side in the Learning Commons
- Students liked the new layout due to more **group seating** options that allowed "individual work in **a group setting**"
- Students disliked having multiple noise sections in a single space

Impact: Consideration for Future Construction

- Students are adaptable to change occurring in Fondren Library
- There is an opportunity to optimize other spaces in Fondren Library
- Signage is effective when multiple copies are visible
- Communal seating options are invaluable for collaboration, thus impacting student belonging and overall success
- Fondren is home to students' individual work in a group setting and the "buzz" which has a direct impact on the in-person experience

How Might We Optimize the In-Person Student Experience in the Library?

Recommendations

- Maintain the social buzz by extending communal space.
- Keep space clean, neat and tidy to give opportunity for use by student.
- Provide more seating to account for influx of displaced students who want to be surrounded by community.
- Provide more outlets and whiteboards.
